


- Factors that affect them all (past, present, future)




Primary Urban Areas

- Represent large towns and cities within the UK




Centre for Cities Primary Urban Areas

What affects a City?

Variable	Source	Description
Density of an Area	2011 Census	Spatial aspect of an area
Retired Population (65+)	2011 Census	Ratio of retired people to the total population
Qualifications Highest Band (Level 4 and above)	2011 Census	Levels of the most skilled of the working population
Economically Inactive Rate	2011 Census	Measure of Worklessness





Economically Inactive Population






What affects a City?

Variable	Source	Description
Part Time Rate	2011 Census	The level of Part Time work in an area
Part Time Change	2001 / 2011 Census	The amount of change in Part Time work for an area
Public Sector Rate	Business Register & Employment Survey	The level of Public Sector employment in an area
Public Sector Change (2008 – 2011)	Business Register & Employment Survey	The change in the Public Sector employment level over time




Part Time Workers

What affects a City?


Variable	Source	Description
Manufacturing Sector Rate	Business Register & Employment Survey	Manufacturing level within a city
Knowledge Intensive Based Services Rate (KIBS)	Business Register & Employment Survey	Knowledge Based Intensive Service level within a city
Business Churn	Business Demography	Difference between business start-ups and closures as a percentage of total business stock



KIBS Rate (Percent) (KIBS / All Jobs) 57.5 - 83.4 52.4 - 57.3 47.5 - 52.4 44.8 - 47.5 40.7 - 44.7

- Small potential workforce




Creating Urban Clusters

- England, Wales & Northern Ireland




6 Urban Clusters LA Variables






6 Urban Clusters LA Variables - South East














Cambridge Study Area


